

- On May 17th, Lebanon Education Center held its' 3rd annual all school Fun Field Day! Mary Callister, DAPE teacher, organized this fun event. Five families attended to participate in the activities with their student. Each class picked a fun activity to play. The activities were wet sponge toss, spin on a bat and carry a ball on a spoon, giant tic tac toe with frisbees, ball hug, football throw through hoops, washer toss, 4 square, and extreme Rock Paper Scissors. Classes rotated to a new activity every five minutes. At the end, everyone earned a Freeze Pop.
- Nate Steller's Cedar SUN high school classroom has been working hard on developing job acquisition skills this school year. The students recently participated in the culmination of all of their hard work: The Amazing Race Downtown Minneapolis. The students went through a rigorous, three-part, interview process to earn a spot in the race as well as completing research on how to effectively use public transportation. For the Amazing Race, the students took the bus and light rail from Eagan to Minneapolis where they were then give a series of clues that led them around the Minneapolis skyway system. The students had to perform a series of tasks which included gathering information on how to apply for a job with certain businesses and interviewing professionals. A software engineer from Target and a hairstylist who owns and runs her own salon volunteered their time to talk with the students about their careers and aspirations. The students did a phenomenal job and gained many great skills regarding job acquisition and public transportation.
- Monday, May 6th, 2019 our students took part in the first ever hair fair at Alliance Education Center. Three local barbers, three local stylists, and one loctician brought their talents to AEC. Students started their morning by participating in an educational presentation that taught them how to care for and manage different hair types and styles. Then over 60 students received free services that day! The smiles on the student's faces were amazing! Each student also received a gift bag full of product samples geared toward their individual hair needs.
