- We are happy to announce that we received our full amount of \$20,000 that we requested as part of Career Pathways Continuous Improvement Grant through MNState. The purpose of this Agreement is: to provide resources to Dakota County Technical College and their Perkins consortium partners to facilitate the review, updating, expansion, and professional development required to improve the Rigorous Programs of Study (RPOS) and Programs of Study (POS) of the consortium. Collaborating partners will include government agencies, local school districts, and the business and industry partners supporting the RPOS and POS. We will use this money in a variety of ways to conduct professional development for our members, create the Transportation M.S. model, review our Technical Skills Assessments within the consortium, meet with industry partners, and provide potential technology within the consortium to help enhance awareness of Technical Education programs.
- Our Construction Trades program has been working on this year's project options. We
 did receive clearance from an independent mold inspection and our state inspector
 that the house built last year is free of mold concerns. This news will allow our classes
 to finish this project with all the inside work yet to be completed.


• On Friday, September 8, 2017 Gideon Pond Elementary School hosted a grand opening of their new playground that is accessible to all children. The students in our D/HH Program
